**The Facts About Media Violence**

**Children watch an average of 28 hours of television**

**By high school graduation, teens have spent more time watching TV than going to bed**

**By age 70, Americans have spent 7 years in front of the TV**

**By about age 11, children have seen 8,000 murders and 100,000 other acts of violence on TV**

## The Facts About Media Violence

5-6 violent acts occur per hour on prime time, with 20-25 acts an hour on children's programming

85% of premium cable programming is violent

73% of violence on TV is rewarded or unpunished and 58% of violent acts show no pain to victims

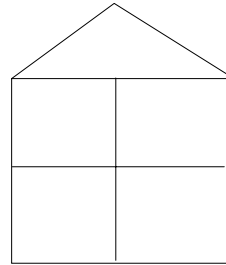
